Curriculum Overview



READING

This term in Reading, students are exploring the books of Roald Dahl in our Author Study unit. We will be unpacking and exploring the main themes, messages and vocabulary that are found in his novels. We will continue working on our reading skills of analysing and interpreting as we dig deeper into his purpose and message as an author.



WRITING

This term in Writing, the Grade 3 students will be tackling three important genres; biographies, narratives and procedurals. Students will use inspiration from our Author Study on Roald Dahl to help us structure our writing and learn more about how an author uses the writing process to help them. These writing pieces will be a great opportunity for us to also apply our writing skills that we have been developing all year, where grammar, spelling and punctuation play an important part in making our writing shine!



MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics this term, students will be investigating different 3D shapes by comparing and identifying key features these shapes withhold. They will also continue to focus on the concepts of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Through these concepts, students will continue to build more on their problem solving strategies to solve simple and complex worded problems.



HUMANITIES

In Humanities this term, students will develop an understanding and an appreciation of the skills that are required to develop a creative story. They will be more confident to use technology, attempting unfamiliar tasks with a 'give it a go' mentality. Students will appreciate how artists have used technology to enhance creative ideas, and they will use technology to bring their creative ideas to life.
